



Purpose & Conduct Form

The Maine Assembly is dedicated to the restoration of a complete and fully operational land and soil jurisdictional court system for the State and Counties serving the people of Maine. Additionally, The Maine Assembly preserves the National Trust, enforces the Public Law, upholds the Federal Constitution owed to our state and people, re-populates our land and soil jurisdiction, fills vacated public offices, and reclaims our material and intellectual public and private assets.

We reserve the right as an Assembly to remove anyone who attempts to destroy or disrupt or commandeer our Assembly. We demand good faith and decorum of all participants. It's important to comprehend that the American Government is very different than the government you've been used to, so, walking in the door, please keep an open mind, as you may not fully know how it functions.

Our lawful government is at peace, so we fly the peacetime flag of our country, not the war flag. These and a great many other things have to be learned and it takes time and commitment to reap the rewards. This requires a commitment to your state, county and your country.

As someone born or Naturalized in this country, you are free to adopt whatever political status you choose. There are three basic jurisdictions (land, air and water) that impact life in various ways and determine whether you stand under public law or private law, and whether you are recognized as a free man/woman, an indentured servant, or a slave. People of this Assembly are all free living men and living women who have adopted their birthright political status.

You cannot have a conflict of interest or be a dual citizen. What this means is, if you have attachments and obligations owed to foreign governments, you are not eligible to participate in The Maine Assembly until such time as all conflicts of interest are resolved. If you are a licensed professional, such as a bar attorney or medical doctor, who depends upon a license or a title of honor bestowed by a foreign government for your livelihood, a significant conflict of interest exists and you cannot participate until it is resolved. Other licenses have to be evaluated to determine if they present such a conflict. Driver licenses typically do not present a serious conflict of interest, for example, but they may, if an individual makes their living as a licensed driver. If you have licenses that could influence your votes, you are required to admit them. Undeclared or unaddressed licenses and memberships in other organizations may result in ineligibility to participate in the Assembly. I clearly comprehend all of the above.

Americans are owed significant benefits and in coming forward and reclaiming your birthright political status, you are also claiming those benefits for yourself and your progeny. These benefits are constitutional guarantees, the right to own land, privacy, protection of your persons, trial by jury, public law, and equal justice. Other people in this country are not necessarily owed these same rights and provisions, because they have chosen to act as citizens owing allegiance to a foreign government. I am aware of this fact.

The General Assembly is composed of dedicated American State Nationals and American State Citizens who are actively restoring our lawful government. Participation in the General Assembly is voluntary and requires peaceful assembly and honorable intentions and conduct.

The General Assembly does not tolerate any actions of rebellion or violence, spreading gossip and slander, disrupting meetings, seeking to control functions of the General Assembly, or any disruptive behavior which regresses the building of all four pillars.

Participating in the General Assembly is an honor, a constructural responsibility and a serious matter. Your admittance is predicated on your honesty and goodwill, which includes you upholding and promoting the Assembly. Doing anything else will be noted as “undermining the process” in which case The General Assembly may take corrective action.

I affirm that I will actively support The Maine Assembly. I will be honest and transparent in my communications. I will not force my will on any participant of the Assembly, nor the Assembly as a whole. I will not gossip, spread rumors, tell lies, bully, hold secret meetings, or engage in any activity that limits our forward movement or undermines the work that has been accomplished. I will not promote violence of any kind nor act as an insurrectionist or enemy combatant. If participating in committees, I will collaborate with all committee members in making decisions and communicate in a timely fashion. I agree to be truthful and honest and comprehend that any false or incorrect information I give or is found during my participation in the Assembly may lead to corrective actions or removal from the Assembly. As an Assembly participant, I will uphold: a) do no harm, b) be peaceful and c) be noncombatant. If my course needs correction, I agree it will be done lawfully through the Assembly process.
